Who are we? We are a group of volunteers that assist owners of seized dogs in the UK. Our time is given voluntarily, and we take no money from fundraising for expenses or administration costs.

What do we do? We offer help and advice to owners of dogs who have been seized under the Dangerous Dogs Act, 1991, particularly victims of Breed Specific Legislation. Dogs that have done nothing wrong, they are ordinary family pets.

What does this mean to owners? They are often faced with bills, amounting to thousands of pounds to get their dog's home. We run auctions, raffles, and general fundraisers to help with funding to help owners with their fight to get their dog home. 100% of all monies raised helps the dogs and their owners.

What kind of dogs does this affect? Most people that have a dog or a puppy have no idea that their pet may be a Pit Bull type until they are seized. This is usually the first time they have heard or come into contact with Breed Specific Legislation and the heartbreak and devastation it can bring with it. 'Type' is determined based solely on measurements and proportion, this act can affect any dog owner, as 'type' dogs can be any cross breed and can even affect certain pure breeds.

If the police come to your house in relation to your dog...

- Do not let them in 'just to have a look'
- Do not take your dog outside
- REMEMBER they must have a warrant to enter your home
- NEVER signed any paperwork

What is life like for an exempted dog like Banjo?

- I must be kept on a lead at all times in public
- I must be insured
- I must be walked by someone over 16
- I must be muzzled in public, and in the car
- I must be neutered
- I must be microchipped
- I cannot be rehomed or 'change keepership' unless my owner dies or becomes incapacitated
- I must not spend more than 30 nights away from my owner



These restrictions are for life, if you break any of these restrictions your dog can be seized again.
